This month our feature is the well-known Nevrol Iron Man. He is a purebred Shire, born in 2004. He definitely holds the farm name high- "Gentle Giants", and is adored by all our fans.



Some information on Shire horses:

The Shire horse is a breed of draught horse and originated from England. The breed comes in many colours, including black, bay and grey. They are a large breed of horse, 16 to 19hh at the withers and weighing 700 – 1000kg. The breed has an enormous capacity for weight pulling. They were originally used as war horses and to pull carriages. Later on they were adapted to be used in agriculture.
